Seining is the ancient way of fishing by dragging a net through the water. No marine life is harmed, and it's fun! At Beczak we use a thirty foot long, hand-woven net with a five foot pole on each end. At low tide (the times vary) our sandy beach is the perfect place to wade in the water.

You're guaranteed a good time as you catch, learn about and hold white perch, striped bass, American eels, blue crabs, hogchokers, pipefish and more before releasing them into the river.

Here's what to expect in Catch of the Day Seining

- 1. Put on chest waders. We have ones from youth size 3 (the average pre-K child) to adult size 15 (HUGE). They will keep you dry.**



- 2. Grab the pole on the end of the seine net. (Someone else will hold the pole at the other end.)**



- 3. Wade into the river and stretch the seine net out as far as it can go.**



- 4. Walk both ends of the net together and to the beach. See, touch and learn about your catch!**
